house	A house is a building designed for people to live in.
street	A public road in a city, town, or village, typically with houses and buildings on one or both sides.
village	A town is a large group of houses, shops and factories where people live. Towns are larger than villages but smaller than cities.
town	A town is a large group of houses, shops and factories where people live. Towns are larger than villages but smaller than cities.
city	A city is a large town. Each country has a capital city, London is the capital city of the UK.
county	A county is made up of cities, towns, or rural populations.
country	A country is land that is controlled by a single government, they can be large or small.
United Kingdom	The United Kingdom comprises England, Scotland, Wales and Northern Ireland
settlement	A settlement is a place where people live.
coastal	An area where the land meets the sea
rural	Rural areas are areas which are not towns or cities. Sometimes called the countryside.
